We've reached further into our community, welcomed new congregants, and expanded our offerings for both existing members and people in the Foothills who need a place to gather, be of service, organize, talk, and create. Our services have featured longtime UU ministers, scientists, artists, teachers, community leaders, and other inspired speakers, each with a twinkle in their eye and a love for and mastery of their subject.

Please note that attendees have not always been a *hundred percent* behind whatever the guest speaker may have been saying, but UUs are, by tradition and nature, critical thinkers if not occasionally ornery.
