Celebrate Beltane with the Temple of Witchcraft Los Angeles!

You are invited to join us as we turn the wheel and celebrate Beltane in a community ritual event. We continue to turn the Wheel of the Year, and make magick on the Beltane Sabbat. This in-person ritual will bring us together in a ritual circle, and guided visionary work. We will work with the image of the maypole, and weave the threads in vision.

While Beltane, usually translated as "the fires of Bel" referring to a Celtic god of light or fire. Most of us know it today as May Day, though it is also the same day as International Workers Day. Many Pagans oriented towards civil justice will also use those associations in their work, celebrations and activism. The key concept of Beltane is the celebration of life, as the vigor of youth, as passion, as the fertility of the land, and the fertility of the people.

We will cast the circle, call the quarters, raise the energy in our mystical circle to journey into our spiritual space and meet the maypole dance in our hearts and minds to call this energy to our body, hearts, and mind. Ritual will be followed by light refreshment and social mingling.
