You can volunteer to be someone's eyes! How cool is that!

Other people shared their disabilities, most of which may not be immediately visible. More than half of the congregation raised their hands when asked who had some type of disability. It was a sharing of compassion as we all deal with our own challenges. Everyone said they really appreciate it when a person asks them, "How can I help?"

Howard is hosting Childhood Stories this month. Next month we are planning to discuss the UUCVH Covenant of Right Relations which was developed several years ago. It affirms way we agree to work, support, and communicate each other as a community. I hope you can join us and bring your own Little Light to Let it Shine!

Board Briefs: August 2023

The UUCVH Board of Directors met on August 21, 2023. The Treasurer reported that the finances were in good condition. **It was agreed that this year's budget be revised in consultation with the Committee Chairs.** The Outreach Director reported that the Urban Home School will be reducing its use of our building to 3 days a week beginning in September. The Sunday Services Director reported that services have been arranged for the next several weeks.

As a result of the Board Planning Meeting several property improvements were approved. The Social Justice chair reported that new writing campaigns promoting voting for young voters, women's health and gun safety were beginning and that a Community Garden plot had been acquired. It was announced that updated Covid Protocols would be posted in various places in our building and included in rental contracts. It was agreed that Board meetings would be scheduled on the 3rd Sunday of each month at 12:30 pm. It was agreed that a Friendship Dinner be held on September 23. Items from the Suggestion Box were reviewed.
